

HE IS ALIVE! HE IS RISEN! ALLELUIA! It has been a week since we celebrated that Jesus Christ is risen and alive. He appears to his apostles who at first don't believe. They think they are seeing a ghost. But they are not. He really is alive. They see him, touch him, watch him eat and converse with him. This faith of ours is not subjective but objective. It is a real, deep and practical relationship with our living Lord who died and then rose for us.

The Apostles had gone to Galilee where Jesus would meet with them. They were excited to see Jesus but also, I believe, fearful. Peter because he had denied even knowing Jesus. The others because they had fled when he was arrested. The same is true for us. We have done things that offended Jesus. We love him but we are embarrassed. We want to see him and yet we stay at a distance. We wonder what his first words to us will be.

This is why we have the feast day of Divine Mercy. It is the very first Sunday after our Lord's Resurrection. Jesus proclaims that his mercy is unlimited and available even to the greatest sinners. He invites us to trust him. "Jesus, I trust in you," he taught us. To Sr. Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun who Jesus appointed to proclaim his great mercy, Jesus said, "Do you think you have written enough about my mercy? What you have written is but a drop compared to the ocean. I am Love and Mercy itself. There is no misery that could be a match for my mercy; neither will misery exhaust it, because as it is being granted---it increases. The soul which will trust in my mercy is most fortunate, because I myself take care of

So, Jesus' love for us is infinite. But He does not force himself on us. He invites us, He pleads with us to come and seek his mercy. He also invites us, as believers, to invite others to trust in him. "Today I am sending you with my mercy," says our Lord, "to the whole world. I do not want to punish aching mankind, but I desire to heal it, pressing it to my merciful heart. I use punishment when they themselves force me to do so; my hand is reluctant to take hold of the sword of justice. Before the day of justice, I am sending the day of mercy."

Jesus sends us his mercy. Remember the story of Jesus about the prodigal son? How the youngest went off, wasted his inheritance and decided to return home? He did not yet have mercy. First, he had to return home. We return home when we come to the sacrament of confession. Second, he spoke asking for forgiveness and being treated as a slave. We come and acknowledge our sins with "Forgive me for I have sinned. My sins are..." It was then that the father gave forgiveness and clothed his son and put a ring on his hand. Jesus grants us his forgiveness. He clothes us and puts a ring on our hands by proclaiming us a child and filling us with

Let us proclaim his love and his mercy for us and for all.

Jesus, I trust in you!
