THE ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Our reading and reflection on God's words to us in the Bible are not always pleasant. We began this week celebrating the wonderful gift of the Body and Blood of our Savior given to us in Holy Communion. What an inspiring and uplifting gift! It still excites me and hopefully you too. But the readings throughout this week have been...well...challenging. We began with 'encourage OUR affliction that we may encourage others in their affliction...' We heard love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you that you may be children of your heavenly Father.' Then we heard those who say 'you fool will be liable to fiery Gehenna.' How many times have I said things much worse than 'you fool'? Furthermore, Jesus adds to the Commandments. He preaches the Beatitudes. He rejects actions that were Ok for people such as rejecting anger, swearing oaths, retaliation, and yes even hating our enemies. Jesus insists we must love our enemies. We are to avoid temptation even to the point of laying down our lives.

God's words to us while often comforting can also be a real challenge. Offering no resistance to one who is evil can be very difficult. We want to be right in what we do and we want others to know it. So, we complain to family and friends. We call the other person a fool. We shine a light (maybe?) to get the other person to apologize. Sometimes we even go to court. But our Lord wants us to resist Satan not humans. We are to help humanity and save our attacks for the devil. Then Our Lord goes deeper. More than just help, He commands us to love our enemies and pray for those who persecute us. We do pray for others. We pray for our families, friends, neighbors. We pray for people at church, in government and those who help the sick and needy. But do we pray for our enemies? Do I pray for the Chinese, the Russians, the North Koreans? Do I pray for the Muslims, especially those living in the Middle East? God desires it. Be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect.

What?!! I can't do that. No one can! "For man it is impossible," our Lord replies, "but with God all things are possible.

Finally, our Lord tells us we are to 'take care not to perform righteous deeds in order that people may see them...' We are to keep them quiet. Giving alms, prayers and fasting is to be a secret. The giving of alms seems easy enough. I give to the church and no one knows what I give. I have my favorite charities that I mail a check to from time to time. But my problem is the Lord satisfied with what I am giving? Or am I giving the same as last year and the year before and the year before? Has my giving remained the same when I get a pay increase? Do I come anywhere near a tithe? And when I fast can I keep quiet about it? All these thoughts are good for reflection. But they are just thoughts. Your thoughts may be different. But the real question for both of us is, what does God think? Does He approve or not? After all, we will all stand before his judgment seat.

The slower pace of summer offers opportunities to nurture faith in creative ways not feasible in the hectic times.



Year of St. Joseph

Pope Francis has decreed a Year of St. Joseph from December 2020 to December 2021 during which Catholics have the opportunity to gain special indulgences.

There are many new ways to receive an indulgence including through prayer, retreats, entrusting one's daily work to the protection of St. Joseph the Worker, acts of piety and service to the poor. The customary conditions for indulgences apply (sacramental confession, receiving the Eucharist and prayers according to the Holy Father's intentions). Visit grdiocese.org to learn more.

•Highlighted Feast Day: June 19. During the Year of St. Joseph, the 19th day of each month is considered a day of devotion to St. Joseph when no other special feast day occurs during that month.

•Devotion to St. Joseph: "Thus, in giving Joseph the Blessed Virgin as spouse, God appointed him to be not only her life's companion, the witness of her maidenhood, the protector of her honor, but also, by virtue of the conjugal tie, a participator in her sublime dignity. And Joseph shines among all mankind by the most august dignity, since by divine will, he was the guardian of the Son of God and reputed as His father among men. Hence it came about that the Word of God was humbly subject to Joseph, that He obeyed him, and that He rendered to him all those offices that children are bound to render to their parents. From this two-fold dignity flowed the obligation which nature lays upon the head of families, so that Joseph became the guardian, the administrator, and the legal defender of the divine house whose chief he was."
