

I typically stay away from political issues. There is so much to say about our faith and belief in God. But there are times when social justice issues become very important that we must speak out. One of those times is now in the issue of our prayers and work for the protection of human life. Beginning in 1976, members of Congress and the White House have consistently supported the Hyde Amendment, a federal policy which has prevented taxpayer dollars from paying for elective abortions. This language has been approved every year since then, regardless of which political party has been in control of Congress or the presidency. In addition to wide legislative support, the general public is highly favorable of the Hyde Amendment and similar provisions. Many public opinion surveys demonstrate that a strong majority of individuals including those of different income levels, races, and positions regarding abortion—in the country oppose using tax dollars to pay for abortion.

Despite public opinion, pro-abortion groups and certain elected officials are campaigning to rescind the Hyde Amendment and to instead implement a policy that would require every federal health program to cover, and every federal health facility to provide, elective abortions. If adopted, the new policy would go as far as to nullify state and local policies against abortion coverage, rescinding the compromise policy agreed to by President Obama and Congressional Democrats in the Affordable Care Act of 2010.

The stakes are high, as the Hyde Amendment saves the lives of mothers and children and respects the consciences of the American people. It is estimated that over 2.4 million children are alive now due to the Hyde Amendment. If Hyde and similar measures are not approved in this year's appropriations process, billions of taxpayer dollars could start being used for elective abortions in this country. If you have not yet signed the petition for no tax payer funds for the abortion industry please do so now. It is at www.NoTaxpayerAbortion.com. In addition please contact your representatives and voice your opposition to this grievous assault on human life. Here in our area it is Representative Peter Meijer, Senator Debbie Stabenow and Senator Gary Peters. Please encourage other family and friends to join with you. The House Committee on Appropriations is finalizing their work on the Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies appropriations bill. As it stands now, the Hyde Amendment and other longstanding, bipartisan provisions are not included.

Please voice your opposition today. Don't leave it for tomorrow. Let our voices be in favor of God's gift of life.
