#### The Eucharist

Bishop Barron writes, "For many Catholics today, the Eucharist is merely a symbol of Christ, and the Mass is merely a collectivity of like-minded individuals gathering to remember his life. But the truth of what is made present on the altar, and what the faithful dare to receive into their bodies and souls, is far more strange and beautiful." Others have written similar words. So it continues to raise the question: How do we come to understand that what we really receive is the Real Presence of Jesus Christ, not a symbol? How do we come to understand that the bread has actually changed into the Body of Christ?

There are those who insist that the bread still exists, so it must be just a symbol. When I was in seminary, they were trying to explain the Eucharist. We were told to consider a table. It can be made of wood, metal, plastic, or some other material. It can be square, rectangular or round. It can have one leg in the center or three or four or even more legs. It can be unpainted or painted in any of a variety of colors. It can be low, medium, or tall in height. It can have a variety of drawers or no drawer at all. Still, in each and every case, we recognize it as a table. How? It is because the object has the property of "table-ness". The size, shape and material of the table are called accidents. That is, they can change without affecting the table. It is the property of table-ness that allows us to recognize it.

So it is with the Eucharist. The bread and the wine are accidents. After the consecration, the accidents of bread and wine now have the property of the Body and Blood of Jesus. It will still taste like bread and wine, but it is not. It is the Eucharist.

When they first explained it this way, it made no sense to me. With time and prayer, it did. But, like so many of Jesus' miracles, our explanations always fall short. They always will. It is a miracle because . . . well, because it is a miracle. It goes way beyond logic. I believe in Jesus' miracle of the changing of the bread and wine into his Body and Blood because <u>He</u> said it. "Take and eat, this is My Body. Take and drink, this is My Blood." It is true because Jesus said it.

Of course, for the Eucharist we need bread. We need wine. We need a validly ordained priest. We need the prayers of the Consecration. But what we need most of all is the promise of Jesus. "Take and eat...take and drink." Jesus gave us *His Body* and *His Blood*.

It is the miracle of the Eucharist. And that is enough for me. It is that simple.
