

from Pope Francis on the World Day of Migrants & Refugees 2021:

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the encyclical Fratelli Tutti, I expressed a concern and a hope that remain uppermost in my thoughts: "Once this health crisis passes, our worse response would be to plunge even more deeply into feverish consumerism and new forms of egotistical self-preservation. God willing, after all this, we will think no longer in terms of 'them' and 'those', but only 'us'".

That horizon is already present in God's creative plan. God created us male and female, different yet complimentary, in order to form a 'we'. God created us in his image, in the image of his own triune being, a communion in diversity.

Salvation history has at its center the mystery of Christ, who died and rose so "that they may all be one." But this 'we' willed by God is broken and fragmented, wounded and disfigured. This becomes all the more evident in moments of great crisis, as is the case with the current pandemic. Our 'we', both in the wider world and within the Church, are crumbling and cracking due to aggressive forms of nationalism and radical individualism. And the highest price is paid by those who most easily become viewed as others: foreigners, migrants, the marginalized, those living on the peripheries.

The truth however is that we are all in the same boat and called to work together so that there will be no more walls that separate us, no longer others, but only a single 'we', encompassing all of humanity.

For members of the Catholic Church, this appeal entails becoming ever more faithful to our being catholic as St. Paul reminded the community at Ephesus: "There is one Body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism."

Indeed the Church's catholicity, her universality, must be embraced and expressed in every age. The Holy Spirit enables us to embrace everyone, to build communion in diversity, to unify differences. In encountering the diversity of foreigners, migrants and refugees and the dialogue, we have the opportunity to grow as Church. All the baptized, wherever they find themselves are by right members of both their local communities and the Church.

The Catholic faithful are called to work together to help the Church to be ever more inclusive as she carries out her mission, "Go, and proclaim the good news." Our Church is called to go out into the streets to heal wounds and seek the straying without prejudice or fear. We will find many migrants, refugees, displaced persons and victims of trafficking to whom the Lord wants his love to be manifested and his salvation preached. The current influx of migrants can be seen as a new frontier for mission, an opportunity to proclaim Jesus Christ and the Gospel message and bear witness to the Christian faith.



Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) is an age-appropriate Liturgy of the Word for Children ages 5 through 3rd graders at the 9:45 AM Sunday Mass. Due to lack of adult leaders this ministry is in jeopardy of not taking place this Fall. Would you be interested in helping this ministry once a month? We are looking for more leaders to help provide this program to our parish families. Volunteers are needed to teach the lessons each week, as well as assist with supervision of the children. This is a great opportunity for adults and middle/ high schoolers to help our parish youngsters learn the Word of the Lord.

What does a CLOW leader do? Just before the Liturgy of the Word begins for the assembly, the children are invited to go with the leader from the church to the CLOW area in the basement of the church. During this time the leader will lead the children through prayers, songs and readings that are simplified for children. The lesson plan is provided prior to class for the leader to review. The children learn about the same Scripture readings as the congregation and are encouraged to share the message with their parents after Mass.

Last year's assembly focused on becoming aware of and deepening our personal relationship with God. Diocesan Assembly 2021 will teach us how to grow and mature as disciples by reflecting on practical aspects of growth in holiness.

The Church teaches and guides us through the joys and hopes, sorrows and anxieties of life as we strive to know, love and serve God more each day. We will reflect on and be inspired by the story of the man born blind found in John 9:1-41.
