





The Assumption of Mary

On Monday, the 15th of August we celebrate the Assumption of Mary, the Mother of God into heaven. Although this was not declared a part of the official doctrine of our Church until November 1, 1950, our Church Fathers and great Doctors spoke of this as something already familiar and accepted by the faithful. Their preaching gave it even greater clarity. They used profound arguments in setting out its nature and meaning. Above all, they brought out more clearly for us the fact that what we commemorate in this feast day is not simply the total absence of corruption from the dead body of the Blessed Virgin Mary but much more. It is her triumph over death and her glorification in heaven following the path set for her by her only Son Jesus Christ.

Saint John Damascene, born about 675, speaks with eloquence when he relates the bodily assumption of the loving Mother of God to her other gifts and privileges: "It was necessary that she who had carried the Creator as a child on her breast should dwell in the tabernacles of God. It was necessary that the bride espoused by the Father should make her home in the bridal chambers of heaven. It was necessary that she, who had gazed on her crucified Son and been pierced in the heart by the sword of sorrow which she had escaped in giving him birth, should contemplate him seated with the Father. It was necessary that the Mother of God should share in the possessions of her Son, and be venerated by every creature as the Mother and handmaid of God."

Saint Germanus of Constantinople considered it in keeping not only with her divine motherhood but also with the unique sanctity of her virginal body that it was incorrupt and carried up to heaven: "In the words of Scripture, you appear in beauty. Your virginal body is entirely holy, entirely chaste, entirely the house of God, so for this reason also it is henceforth a stranger to decay: a body changed, because a human body, to a preeminent life of incorruptibility, but still a living body, excelling in splendor, a body inviolate and sharing the perfection of life.

The Assumption of Mary fills us with joy. It encourages us along the way still remaining for us before we reach heaven. She gives us courage and energy to reach the sanctity we are called to by our vocation. As we struggle to be good sons and daughters of God, let us make an effort to keep our souls clean through confession and the Eucharist. If we die in God's grace, we will go to heaven and receive our eternal reward.

What does Mary's Assumption mean for us?

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII infallibly declared that, "having completed the course of her earthly life," the Blessed virgin Mary was taken up, body and soul, into heavenly glory.

Although this doctrine was declared relatively recently, the Church's belief in it isn't new. Sacred Scripture and Tradition repeatedly emphasized Mary's sinlessness and holiness (luke1:28), and her deep involvement in the mysteries of Christ's life. Given this, we believe Jesus preserved her body from decay and raised her to heavenly glory.

For us, the Assumption, is a "sneak preview" of what our ultimate destiny can be if we are faithful to Christ, as Mary was- having our glorified bodies, sinless and perfectly happy. What she is now, we hope someday to be.

Moreover, the Assumption reveals the value of our bodies in God's plan. When God created us in His Image, He created us body and soul and said it was "very good" (Genesis 1:31). It's so good, that He intends to raise us, bodily, into His glory.
