

Welcome to the New Year!

Welcome to the New Year! Today is the first day of our New Liturgical Year, the First Sunday of Advent. Advent as everyone knows is a time of preparation. It's a time of celebrating once again the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ. Even though He was born more then 2000 years ago, it is such an important birthday for us that we still celebrate it. Advent is also a time when we celebrate Jesus with us in the here and now. Part of that celebration will be a time in adoration which we will have at 7:00 PM on December 13<sup>th</sup>. Finally, during Advent, we also pray for and look forward to our Lord's second coming when He will invite us to join with Him in eternal life in His heavenly kingdom. So, we have a lot to celebrate.

As we prepare ourselves for this, it is necessary that we look at ourselves. Are we ready? Jesus Christ is our King as we recognized just before beginning our Advent preparations. Have we invited Him to be the King of our lives? When Jesus was with His disciples, He asked them, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" They replied, "Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." Jesus asked, "But who do you say that I am?' This is a question that Jesus askes you and me. Who is He for us? Throughout the Scriptures, Jesus continually demonstrates His divinity. Only Jesus had the power to change the water into wine at the wedding feast. Jesus would say to the leper "be healed" and he was. He would tell the blind to see and the deaf to hear and the lame to walk and miraculously they would be healed. The suffering woman just touched His coat and she was healed. The man who was lowered down through the roof was healed. And Jesus multiplied the loaves and fishes to feed thousands with just a few loaves and two fish. Jesus even told people "Their sins were forgiven." Their SINS WERE FORGIVEN! No one but God could do that! And Jesus did, for He is God.

So, who do you say that He is? Today? And every day? If we say Jesus is God (and who wouldn't?), then it means our lives have to change. If Jesus is God, how can we NOT do what He asks of us? He is the way, the truth and the life. Not a way but the one and only way for us to gain eternal life.

Let us begin once again prepare ourselves for Jesus Christ. Let us gather together to worship Him. Let us listen to His words. Let us put them to work in out lives. Then we will be really ready to welcome into Him into our lives.

## Matthew 24:37-44, Don't be afraid, do be prepared

The Church calendar is a gift to help us mark the seasons of joy and sorrow, work and rest. We can withdraw from the pattern of the world and remember that we wait in joyful hope for Jesus to come.

Beginning at the end of this month, the season of Advent is a time of warning and a time of preparation. Next month we celebrate Jesus' coming at Christmas. But he will come twice more: at our own death, and at the end of time. This Gospel reading reminds us that we will never know ahead of time just when he will come for us. Advent is the time to ask, "What do I need to do to be ready to greet the Lord?"

Start by examining your conscience and pick one or two sinful practices you want to eliminate. Then try to spend more time in prayer, attend Mass faithfully, and go to Confession.

Finally, spend a few extra minutes each day in prayer. Then when Christmas comes, you will know you are ready to greet the Lord with joy.
