

#### The Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

## **Reflection by Father Oscar**

Luke 6:12-19

"Jesus departed to the mountain to pray, and he spent the night in prayer to God. When day came, he called his disciples to himself, and from them he chose Twelve, whom he also named Apostles: Simon, whom he named Peter, and his brother Andrew, James, John, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James the son of Alphaeus, Simon who was called a Zealot, and Judas the son of James, and Judas Iscariot, who became a traitor.

And he came down with them and stood on a stretch of level ground. A great crowd of his disciples and a large number of the people from all Judea and Jerusalem and the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon came to hear him and to be healed of their diseases; and even those who were tormented by unclean spirits were cured. Everyone in the crowd sought to touch him because power came forth from him and healed them all."

This Gospel passage allows us to follow the apostolic journey of Jesus. I would like to highlight 2 topics among many:

1. The prayer of Jesus: What was his prayer like? types of prayer? or why did he pray?

Let me say that Jesus prayed to maintain a permanent connection with his Father. Only in this union, he found the reason to give meaning to his life. Jesus' prayer was permanent, and at times it was nocturnal and prolonged, that it could last until dawn. The form of his prayer may have been marked by the Jewish style of prayer. Psalms, songs, reading, and listening to God's presence and love. Biblical meditation too is the basis of all prayer.

Jesus went to prayer as discerning processes such as we see in this gospel reading: for example, to choose his evangelization partners he prays all night long. Jesus in front of his Father weighs each disciple, the capacity of each one, his character, (one's history with good and bad things) the history of each one with its ups and downs as well as the openness of each one to the work of the Kingdom of God for humanity.

2. Among the twelve names in Luke's gospel, we find a bit of everything. Let me explain to it, Jesus did not choose saints and nobles. His gaze fell on simple fishermen, blood brothers, a corrupt tax collector, and even an armed man like Simon, the Zealot. He also chose an ambitious man with political interests like Judas Iscariot. He educated and formed them for the mercy of his Father's Kingdom. The end result was not an ideal outcome. Our patron, Peter denied Him, others left Him at the crucial times and, worst was Judas' betrayal. It is worst of the worst! What was surprising in spite of this, Jesus sent them after his resurrection to proclaim the good news of the Kingdom of God to all the nations. Let us say again, in spite of our weaknesses it is Jesus' Spirit who guides us on our mission.

Today, I invite you to add your name on this disciples' list, which is always open. In silence, let us thank the Lord for having written our names in the Book of Life.
