Why do Catholics have two versions of the Creed? –Growing in $\mathsf{Faith}^\mathsf{TM}$

Both Creeds summarize what Catholics believe but were written at different times for different purposes. The Apostles' Creed is the summary of the beliefs of the early Church. The Nicene Creed is the expanded form of the Apostles' Creed, stemming from two Church councils (Nicaea, 325 AD; Constantinople, 381 AD) to combat Arianism, which proposed Jesus was not God but a kind of supersaint. The Nicene Creed emphasizes Jesus' divinity, His divine Sonship, and the divinity of the Holy Spirit.



Dear Friends in Christ,

Today the Catholic Church begins Respect Life Month. The theme this year is "Radical Solidarity," which means we are courageously pro-woman, promoting a choice that truly protects, accompanies, and supports women and their children. This is and has always been the work of the Church. We must remain engaged, especially after the numerous challenges to life that we have seen in Michigan.

Last November, voters passed Proposal 3, a citizens' initiative to amend the Michigan constitution to establish a new right to reproductive freedom, including the right to abortion. Just last month, Michigan lawmakers introduced the Reproductive Health Act, a series of legislation in which supporters of abortion have said they are seeking to repeal informed consent for abortion, as well as requirements that abortion clinics meet basic health and safety standards. These measures are not in "radical solidarity" with women. These common-sense measures need to remain to protect the health and safety of women seeking an abortion in our state.

As Catholics, we are called to stand for and create a consistent ethic of life in our communities. This work has never been more important than now. How can you get engaged?

- Sign up for the Catholic Advocacy Network through the Michigan Catholic Conference. Their weekly e-blast will provide you with legislative updates from Lansing and where the Catholic Church stands in her support or disapproval of the legislation.
- Join me and thousands of other Catholics for the State March for Life on Nov. 8 in Lansing. The March is one way we can use our voices on behalf of defenseless children in our state.
- Volunteer at a Catholic Charities West Michigan baby pantry, a pregnancy aid center, or with your parish's respect life group. Catholic Charities West Michigan's baby pantries provided approximately 550,000 diapers to more than 1,000 parents last year alone. What a way to witness to life!

During this Respect Life Month, let us reflect more deeply on the sacredness of every human life. I invite you to visit the diocesan website (grdiocese.org) for more information on Respect Life Month resources to support your efforts. Saint Maximilian Kolbe, pray for us!

Dear faithful of St. Edward, and SS. Peter and Paul:

It has been a time where I have been happy. My happiness has been in serving the migrant people of God to the best of my ability. I have tried to live in a permanent contemplation of God in the daily lives of these migrant families.

As the years have gone by, I have learned some very basic English, but not yet the good-quality of English I had hoped for. In spite of this language limit, I always tried to be available to help our pastor. Thank you for your patience in trying to comprehend the messages I have given with love and hopefully received with gratitude. The infused knowledge that the Spirit gives us was always at work, sowing the truth of God in our lives.

I would like one day to be able to sit and listen to you and talk with you about faith, life, dreams, and hopes, in English.

I always dreamed that we could have a bilingual mass at SS. Peter and Paul. It would be the ultimate expression of Pentecost and of the Church, like the net that holds all the fish. Reaching multicultural parishes requires a process, a pedagogy, and if we all do our part, we can accomplish what we profess, that in Christ we are one body, one heart, and one soul.

In dialogue with our Bishop, and after praying and discerning God's will, it was decided that I will be leaving the community of St Edward and SS Peter and Paul to work with 3 priests in various parishes in Grand Rapids. It seems like a nice pastoral project and I look forward to serving God in this new capacity.

Thanking you in advance for your prayers and love and I will be in touch with many of you.

May God continue to bless the communities of St. Edward and SS. Peter and Paul.
