With Flowers and candy, phone calls and visits, and other gifts, sons and daughters of all ages, along with husbands and other relatives, will be giving honor ant thanks to mothers around the country. As we should. Remember the commandment, "Honor your Father and your Mother." It is good to do so. The overwhelming majority of us do so willingly. Why do Catholics have different images of the Blessed Mother? Growing in FaithTM

In the well-known Marian apparitions approved by the Church — Guadalupe, Lourdes, Fatima, and Kibeho — the Blessed Virgin Mary's appearance seems to adapt to the local culture of those to whom she appears, while her central message remains consistent: a call to prayer, repentance and renewed devotion to the Faith. For example, the miraculous image of Our Lady of Guadalupe features symbolic elements that the Aztec people would have understood, communicating the Gospel message in a way that resonated within their cultural context. This adaptation of Mary's appearance underscores her closeness to the communities she visits, reflecting the profound truth of her spiritual motherhood of all Christians.



"Figuring the Kingdom: The Substance of Things Hoped For"

Donnelly Center at Aquinas College 157 Woodward Ln. SE, Grand Rapids

Thursday, May 15 7-9 p.m.

In *Spe Salvi*, Pope Benedict XVI proposed that the theological virtues of faith, hope, and love really are the "substance," the presence in the soul, of "things hoped for. The Kingdom of God is at once present to us now even as it has not yet arrived. How does the Church figure, or imagine, this in-between state? In this lecture by James Matthew Wilson, we'll consider the testimony of saints, popes, philosophers, and poets (Benedict, St. Augustine, Jacques Maritain, and Thomas MacGreevy) all of whom found different ways to figure the kingdom, to express the relationship of our presence, here in a particular place at a particular time, and the everlasting kingdom of God.

James Matthew Wilson is Cullen Foundation Chair in English Literature, the Founding Director of the Master of Fine Arts program in Creative Writing, at the University of Saint Thomas, Houston, Texas, and Catholic Studies Scholar in Residence at Aquinas College.
